Many times over the years I have heard the Gospel written by the Apostle John referred to as the Gospel of love. I does not take very long to understand this reference once one begins to study the book of John. This gospel is filled with stories and events that impress upon the reader the love that God has for his creation. From the beginning through the ministry of Jesus and his ultimate expression of love for mankind in the death on the cross, the love God has for man and his strong desire for man to return to Him is evident.

In this gospel we read of the sorrow Jesus had for those who did not listen and the strong rebukes for those who not only failed to serve God but also actively sought to prevent others from serving properly. protection of those who would take up His work in the midst of persecution and opposition after His return to the Father.

We see the expression of love toward his mother as he hung on the cross. His love even for those who killed him is seen in his prayer of forgiveness and his mercy on those who died with him. His love and concern is still evident as He appears to the Apostles after the resurrection. He wants them to believe and was willing to take the steps necessary to strengthen their faith. Even His plea to Peter for leadership among the brethren shows His love and care for both the Apostles and those who would listen to their message of salvation.

We also read a few things about our love for Him. As He speaks to His Apostles on that final night, He tells reminds them of what it means to love Him. We all remember *"If you love me, you will keep my commandments."* John 14:15 and *"Whoever has my commandments and keeps them, he it is who loves me."* John 14:21 With these statements and the surrounding context, Jesus gives us no escape from our responsibility to do the will of God. If we are not willing to give Him our complete submission we cannot say that we truly love Him. He expects our obedience in all things and tells us here that such obedience is an expression of our love for Him.

He also tells us that such submissive love will bring us into a relationship with him and the Father that will allow them to live with us all our days on earth. It is this love in obedience that reveals both the Father and the Son in our hearts and minds. If we desire to feel the presence of God in our life we must submit to the Word that He has left to guide us through love. This love will be evident in all our dealings here on Earth for they will be controlled by love of God. It will show in how we treat one another and especially our relationships with family and brethren. When we truly love God we will show our love for others. If we cannot love those who are with us here how can we possibly love God who cannot be seen here. (**1John 4:20**) Our love for God, like God's love for us, is seen in how we deal with others. John makes it clear that God loves us. Now, do I love God?
