Written toward the end of his long stay in Ephesus around 55 AD, this letter to the brethren in Corinth deals with several problems that had arisen since they had obeyed. Division and sexual immorality are dealt with as well as some issues with spiritual gifts. Paul urges them to focus on helping one another serve God. His passage on love points them, and us today, to the heart of many of these issues. They were not giving themselves to the work, rather they were expecting the work to give to them. We need to learn the necessity of giving of self in service to others. Much of our difficulty arises from a focus on self rather than others and God.

presented to urge upon those who are not Christians to respond to the Lord's pleadings But they spurn invitation after invitation. They spurn the yearnings, the love and encouragement of those who are interested in them. Why is it?

Why is it that "Christians" have to be urged to regularly attend the worship and study assemblies? One would think that those who "love" the Lord would not have to be urged (and really, those who love the Lord do not have to be urged to attend). But those who take the responsibility of teaching, spend so much of their time trying to get people to do what is good for them and what they know they ought to do. Why is it?

Does this not speak of the fact that others love our souls more then we love our own when we have to be urged to do what is good for our eternal security? Others spend hours in study and prayer, but we lightly turn away their pleadings. Why is it?

(I hope as you consider the questions raised in this article you will take the time to consider if you can find any similarities to your own life in them. It is very easy to say, "I hope Brother X and Sister Z take this message to heart." What is actually necessary is for each of us to honestly consider our own practice and activities in light of the teaching emphasized in this article.

We all know very well that there is only one individual under our control. I can only change myself, not someone else. As I have told some in the past, if a particular lesson or article hits home for you or steps on your toes, that just means that you and I have similar things to work on.

Most of what is considered in this article falls into the "basics" category for our congregation, but they are still things that need to be considered. That tells us that we can never relax from our vigilance in service to God. Do I love myself enough to examine my own heart regarding these "simple" things?
