Philippians 4:5-7 Let your reasonableness be known to everyone. If we don't communicate with the folks in the world around us, most of them will never find their way to the peace that is found only in Christ.

(Yes, if you work through the first paragraph you will know this is a rerun, but then so was every Gilligan I watched. The lesson is still valid today. Are we communicating the salvation we enjoy to those who need it? Is there someone stuck scared and alone who I can 'rescue' from that isolation? That is what God expects of His children.
