particular nation. It is not dependent on laws being in its favor. It's success is guaranteed by our risen Savior, not by politicians making promises or legislative bodies issuing rulings. If everything flipped again tomorrow, the kingdom of God is the same and the gospel will still be the gospel. And our task as Christians will remain just as it is has been. We are still to be salt and light, seeking to please God, and seeking to help others be reconciled to Him (Matthew 5:13-16).

So, Christians, buckle up for the long haul. The world is still going to be the world, and kingdoms of this world will reflect worldly endeavors, including the one in which we live. Our effort is one of persuasion, not force. Making laws may be needed for a society to survive, but the only way to change hearts is through the call of the Spirit. Regardless of the laws in place, the same gospel is needed to turn the hearts of people to the Lord. You cannot legislate that. You cannot force it. You cannot intimidate others into it. You cannot protest and coerce people into the Lord's kingdom.

Ours is an eternal perspective, walking by faith, making it our aim to please God, knowing there is judgment to come. *"Therefore, since we know the fear of the Lord, we try to persuade people"* (2Corinthians 5:7-11).
