We Have Interest In Resurrection

Man's interest in future also involves interest in resurrection - Job 14:14

Paul manifest interest in it. Philippians 3:7-14

Christ had the power of resurrection - John 2:19; 12:17-18

Paul's interest in Philippians 3 was in power generated by the resurrection

To what does the resurrection of Christ give power?

Vindicates:

Claim Of Deity - John 9:35-38; 1:14; 10:36

Apostles so claimed - Matthew 16:16-18; 1John 4:14-15; Acts 9:20; Romans 1:3-4

Resurrection of Christ is the basis of our faith - John 8:24; John 20:30-31; 1Corinthians 15:17

Confirms:

Divinity of His mission - Luke 19:10; John 6:38

Competency of His authority - Matthew 28:18; Ephesians 1:20-21

The authority of His teaching - Matthew 7:28-29

Hence, His right to expect (demand) obedience on Man's part - Matthew 7:21; 28:18–20; Acts 3:22–23; Hebrews 5:8–9; 2John 9; Revelation 22:18–19

Affirms:

Adequacy of Christ's sacrifice for sin - Matthew 26:28; 1Peter 1:18–19; Hebrews 9:11–14; Hebrews 9:22

Blood of Bulls and goats not enough - Hebrews 10:4; 9:26-28; 10:26-30

He has a continuing priesthood - Hebrews 7:22-24

For our present salvation - Hebrews 4:14-16; 2:14-18; 2Timothy 1:12

Hope of life to come - 1John 2:25; Titus 1:2-3

Hope an anchor of soul--enters veil - Hebrews 6:19

Enforces:

Obligation to holy life - Colossians 2:11–12; 3:1-17; Romans 6:1–7; 8:4; 2Corinthians 5:17; Titus 2:11–12 How does resurrection enforce obligation of holy life?

Assures:

Victory over death - 1Corinthians 15:12–19,54–58; Hebrews 6:18–20; Romans 8:24; Revelation 2:10

A source of comfort to the Christian - 1Thessalonians 4:18

Power of Resurrection

Vindicates claim that Jesus is Son of God

Confirms Divinity of His mission, competency of His authority, and authority of His teaching; hence our need to obey

Affirms adequacy of Christ (sacrifice for sin)

Enforces obligation of Holy life

Assures us of victory - Acts 17:30-31
